## **63rd Annual Maine Woodland Owners & Tree Farm Forestry Field Day Program**

**Location:** Maine Youth Fish and Game Association Camp *and* Wells Forest, Milford, ME

**Date:** Saturday, September 9, 2017

*For those who prefer not to drive their vehicles on gravel roads, parking and bus transportation to the MYFGA Camp will be available from the Madden Timberlands headquarters located off Route 2 in Milford/Costigan – the address is 506 Main Road, Milford (blue shop with “Fernald Madden and Sons” on the side).*

**8:50 a.m.                                  Opening Remarks & Welcome**

*Exhibitors’ tent, education stations, children’s activities, and refreshments all day.*

***Children 15 and under are encouraged to fish Pickerel Pond, which is literally a spin cast away from the Camp building. The pond is frequently stocked with trout from Maine State fish hatcheries.***

*Flume Table* Fun and interactive demonstration of stream crossing techniques for forest management activities – Sustainable Forestry Initiative.

*“Operation Game Thief”* -in cooperation with the Maine Warden Service, will show the “Wall of Shame,” a mobile display of the bad effects of poaching on Maine’s fish and wildlife.

**Guided Tours of the Tree Farm: vans will shuttle folks from the MYFGA Camp to the Wells Tree Farm**

**Guided Forest Walking Tour** – Walking tours of moderate length will reveal a gorge on the beautiful Sunkhaze Stream, and showcase artifacts of the 1800’s era LeBallister shingle mill, as well as other aspects of local history and natural beauty. Walking trail construction and surfacing work done with a mechanized mulcher on a tracked skid steer machine will be demonstrated live.

**Guided Motorized Van Tour** – See live demonstrations of cut-to-length in-woods processing and forwarding, as well as the results of restorative silvicultural practices such as crop tree release, pre-commercial thinning, and low-density pine thinning. All the live equipment demonstrations will feature Madden Sustainable Forestry Inc., winner of the Professional Logging Contractor’s 2017 Logger of the Year Award. Kirby Ellis, recipient of the 2017 New England Chapter of the Society of American Foresters Austin Cary Practicing Professional Award, will be on hand to answer questions.

## Third Party Assessment Results

Thanks to all of the Maine Tree Farmers, inspectors, and volunteers that participated in the recent Northeast Regional Tree Farm assessment. Every year, two states are selected from each region, and Tree Farms within those states are randomly selected based on parcel size and geographic location. This year, Maine and Maryland were selected to represent the North East. (That's right, Maryland is considered part of the Northeast!) While it's too early to be official, the Northeast was recommended for certificate renewal! That determination will be finalized once the assessment reports are published.

How did we really do? As we mentioned in the last newsletter, the Maine Tree Farm Committee received high praise for management, policy, and functionality. Our committee is very active and involved compared to some other states. As expected, the quality of the work being performed on the ground was also excellent. Thank you, Tree Farmers! We do however have room for improvement in updating management plan materials to meet the current 2015 standards. We also need to find a way to better monitor changes in acreage, ownership, and the general interest of Tree Farmers. The most difficult part of the audit was verifying the status of the selected Tree Farms, and subsequently collecting all the required management plan material before the site visit. It was a common occurrence to reach out to a Tree Farmer, only to find the information we had about their Farms was incorrect or outdated, or they were unwilling to participate. A key part of forest certification is documenting a verifiable origin of harvested forest products.

In the coming months, the Maine Tree Farm Committee will contact you about your continuing interest in the program, the size and makeup of your Tree Farm, and the status of your management plans. With your help and cooperation, the next assessment will be stronger and less stressful for all of those involved. Thanks again, and great job Maine!


